THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

The Lord be with you.
And also with you.
Lift up your hearts.
We lift them up to the Lord.
Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing,
always and everywhere to give thanks to you,
Almighty God, creator of heaven and earth.

that we may be for the world the body of Christ,
redeemed by his blood.

By your Spirit make us one with Christ,
one with each other,
and one in ministry to all the world,
until Christ comes in final victory
and we feast at his heavenly banquet.

Through your Son Jesus Christ,
with the Holy Spirit in your holy Church,
all honor and glory is yours, almighty God,
now and forever.

Because there is one loaf,

The bread which we break

In the center of your table, you will find a small loaf of bread and a cup of juice. You are invited to share in the communion feast with one another, around your tables. We will commune at the tables by intinction; please tear off a piece of bread, dip it into the cup, and receive the communion elements.

All of the bread for today's communion service is gluten-free, so that all persons at each table may share in the one loaf. For those with a sensitivity to grape juice, a cup of water is available; please raise your hand and a communion assistant will bring it to your table. Our Conference Health & Healing Council has also provided individually-wrapped antibacterial cleansing cloths that you may use before communion.

Please share in the feast with each other, around your tables, as you feel led. You may say "the body of Christ given for you" and "the love of Christ poured out for you" as you share.

After all have served one another, the body will stand and join together in singing:

THE WITNESS OF THE GENERATIONS THAT HAVE COME BEFORE

*LITANY OF THANKSGIVING

One: God has called us into relationship from the beginning of Creation. As Creation was spoken into being, God called people into covenant and witness.

Many: For the witness of those who came generations before us, whose stories and testimonies helped to spark fires in our hearts, we give God thanks!

One: Each of us serving God can point to those whose lives pointed us towards God.

Many: For the witness of those who faithfully served as our teachers and pastors, our leaders

and encouragers, our forebears and models, whose lives kindled the fire in our imaginations, we give God thanks!

One: God continues to move in our lives today.

Many: For our own witness, which burn in our bellies, we give God thanks!

One: We do not receive faith only for ourselves; we pass it on.

Many: For those who come after us, watching our lives and living our hope, we give God thanks!

SCRIPTURE – PSALM 90

Voice 1: God, it seems you've been our home forever; long before the mountains were born,
Long before you brought earth itself to birth,

Voice 2: from "once upon a time"

Voice 3: to "kingdom come"

Voice 1: you are God.

Voice 2: So don't return us to mud, saying,

Voice 3: "Back to where you came from!"

One: On this day when we gather to honor the faithful ministries of our retirees, we gather in celebration. Yet on this day, our celebration is bittersweet. One of the retirees we intended to celebrate today is now one of those whose names we will lift, in grief and remembrance, during tomorrow's Memorial Service. In this moment that would have celebrated his retirement, we honor the memory of Rev. Christopher Wollyung.

THE WITNESS TO THE COMING GENERATIONS

“PASSING THE MANTLE”

At this moment in the service, we invite this year's class of retirees to gather around this year's class of ordinands. In this holy moment, our retirees will present prayer shawls to the ordinands while anointing them and praying for them, symbolically “passing the mantle” to the rising generation of church leaders in the Eastern Pennsylvania Annual Conference.

BLESSINGS FOR MINISTRY

One: We invite all who will begin their first appointment or assignment this year to stand and join together to share thanksgiving for those who are retiring, the generation that have served before:

*Those Entering First Appointments: We give thanks to God for all those who have gone before.

May those who are retiring know blessings of having planted seeds in ministry and watched some seeds of ministry come to fruit.

*Retirees: We give thanks to God that you have answered the call to ministry and seek to serve

God and God's people. May generations rise up to know God through you and the faithful witness you inspire in others.

Those beginning their first appointments or assignments may be seated.

All those who have served in appointed/assigned ministry for at least 5 years are invited to stand.

One: As we share together in this odd and wondrous calling to ministry, let us pronounce blessing in our collective lives of ministry. We invite all those who have served in ministry for at least 5 years to join together in sharing their wisdom:

Those serving at least 5 years: We give thanks to God for those who will begin their first appointment or assignment this year. May they know the delight of ministry and the wisdom of a mentor in ministry.

Those who have served in ministry for at least 10 years may remain standing. All others may be seated.

One: We invite those who have served in ministry for at least 10 years to share together their wisdom:

Those serving at least 10 years: We give thanks to God for those who have begun to discover the unique rhythms of their lives in ministry, and who continue to be urged forward by the power of their calling. May they work alongside lay co-laborers to serve communities in need of the lived presence of God's grace.

Those who have served in ministry for at least 25 years may remain standing. All others may be seated.

One: We invite all those who have served in ministry for at least 25 years to share together their wisdom:

Those serving at least 25 years: We give thanks to God for those who have known joy and challenge in their years of ministry. May they seek to raise up new generations of leaders who, in the heart of joy and the face of challenge, will reinvigorate ways of sharing the gospel message across every generation.

Those who have served in ministry for at least 35 years may remain standing. All others may be seated.

One: We invite all those who have served in ministry for at least 35 years to share together their wisdom:

Those serving at least 35 years: We give thanks to God for those who have served faithfully in ministry, participating in lives of faith and witnessing growth – within individuals and across generations. May they finish strong, not discouraged by the seeds that did not take root, but encouraged by all of the strewn seeds of faith that might still take root.

Those who have served in ministry for at least 50 years may remain standing. All others may be seated.

One: We invite all those who have served at least 50 years in ministry to share together their wisdom:

Those serving at least 50 years: We give thanks to God for those who have followed us in ministry, and who now continue to serve God and God's people in new ways. May they share God's word and way, God's grace and generosity, with steadfast commitment through their days.

THE WESLEY COVENANT PRAYER

One: As those retiring have led us, let them lead all clergy in reciting the words of the Wesley Covenant prayer together. We invite all clergy to stand. We invite all laity to remain seated and pray for our clergy as they covenant together.

It has been our tradition for our clergy, during this covenant prayer, to make some gesture of connection – joining hands, placing hands on shoulders, etc. – as they join together in making and renewing this covenant before God.

All Clergy:

**I am no longer my own, but thine.
Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt.
Put me to doing, put me to suffering.
Let me be employed for thee or laid aside for thee,
exalted for thee or brought low for thee.
Let me be full, let me be empty.
