Helping students seek higher learning and a higher purpose

On college campuses is where many young people begin to "decide what their faith in God means to them," says the Rev. Dan Lebo, a church pastor and Coordinator of Spiritual Life at Lebanon Valley College. "We are invited into their lives as they make sense of…their transition into adulthood."

Lebo's team provides listening ears and caring hearts, while overseeing vital student ministries that include weekly worship services, group dialogues, Bible studies and fun but formative field trips and social events. They also work with supportive congregations to offer students "home-away-from-home church connections."

"Teaching the meaning of life to first-year students" is among the Rev. Paul Clark's plans for campus ministry at Albright College this coming school year. He'll add to that pastoral and spiritual counseling, an International Day of Peace celebration, a new volunteer center and training students to seek justice through nonviolence.

At Millersville University Ed Weber coordinates United Campus Ministry (UCM), a network of ecumenical campus ministries that connects the university community in prayer, fellowship and cooperative service. The ministry operates the Campus Cupboard, which provides supplemental food items and a weekly community meal to respond to the growing problem of food insecurity among college students.

And UCM's The Hub is a busy multipurpose student center where students gather to do homework, play games, plan activities, forge friendships and build community.

Campus Ministry: It's about relationships and religion

At Drexel University's Open Door Christian Community, the Revs. David Piltz and Diana Esposito work as a team to provide opportunities for students to "share their thoughts and feelings about faith."

Weekly worship services begin with food, fellowship, faith-talks, and occasionally, campus-wide events like cookouts to broaden interest. And interest is growing, as even non-Christian students have come seeking help with struggles over their faith, sense of purpose and identity.

Campus ministers help students seek not only higher learning but also a higher purpose, grounded in faith, discipleship and supportive community. Campus Ministry is as much about relationships as religion. These are the lives we help nurture when we give to the offering that supports their ministries.
